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# INTRODUCTION.

THE AHMADIYVA MOVEMENT "was founded in 1890 at Qadian, in the Punjab, by Hazrat Mirza Ghulam Ahmad. He claimed to be the Promised Messiah, whose advent had been foretold in the Bible and in certain Islamic books, and the promised Teacher whose appearance in the last age had been foretold by almost every prophet. . . . . Comprehension and tolerance are strong features of the Ahmadiyya cult.—The Times, London, 2/10/26.

Lord Halifax (then Irwin) addressed a deputation of the Ahmadiyya Community on 25/2/'27 and said:— "The growth of your Community since that day, in the short course of one generation, is the measure of the belief which as a body you have reposed in the teachings of your Founder and his successors." "You have appreciated the necessity of combined effort and financial sacrifice for educational ideals, if lives are to be fuller, happier and more useful. 
British Muslims welcome Col. Douglas when it was snowing.



- "Known to more than a million and a half of the Ahmadiyya Community in India as 'the just Pontius Pilate', Colonel Montagu W. Douglas . . . met yesterday at the London Mosque, Hazrat Maulvi Sherali.
- "Colonel Douglas, who retired from the Indian Government service in 1920, told the Daily Sketch yesterday that the trial took place in 1897 in the Gurdaspur district of the Punjab. The accused was Mirza Ghulam Ahmad.
- "'For some years previously Ahmad had been hailed by his followers as the Promised Messiah, and his teachings had caused great controversy among the Hindus and other religious sects of India. . . .
- "I can visualise him now, standing before me accused of conspiracy to murder a missionary of the Church Missionary Society.
- "'An Indian boy of 16, the chief witness for the prosecution, declarded that Ahmad had instructed him to murder the missionary, but he made several conflicting statements.
- "'I quickly reached the conclusion that there was no case against Ahmad and acquitted him. Later it was learned that the boy had been coerced to tell a story that was completely false. The trial became famous and Ahmad's adherents grew to immense proportions'."










Shahzada Abdul Majid of Ludhiana goes to Iran at his own expense and dies in Tehran, preaching the New Gospel to his fellowmen.




